Festivities begin at 5:30 p.m. on **Sunday, December 2** at the Tram's Mountain Station kicking off with a holiday performance by the **Palm Springs High School Madrigals & String Quartet**. Then the Bennetts light the Tram's landmark **45-foot tree comprised of 4,000 LED lights**, which can be seen throughout the Coachella Valley.

Since the 2016 premier of "Desert Flippers," these Wisconsin transplants have been transforming Palm Springs one 'unloved' house at a time...and showing the rest of the country the desert's beautiful scenery and weather.

Renovating 20 properties a year—while raising three small children—is no small feat, and this couple takes it in stride. But when they go behind the walls of houses that live in triple-digit heat, they never quite know what they might find—scorpions, rattlesnakes, black widows and even squatters! In each episode of "Desert Flippers," Eric and Lindsey search out a diamond in the rough, but they might find something that's just plain rough!
